

We are closer than ever to reviving the Banting Homestead.

Building Permit Secured! We have taken a major leap forward: the Building Permit to restore the Farmhouse has been secured, thereby allowing SFBLF to begin pivotal renovations. The Farmhouse is central to the very place where Sir Fred spent so many of his formative years, influencing the scientist and altruist he would become. Major renovations will commence following a Demolition Party on Saturday, September 24th (see page 3 for details). Insulin Now a Legitimate Canadian Currency

This November, the Bank of Canada is issuing new polymer bank notes that celebrate Canadian innovation. Finance Minister Jim Flaherty describes the bills as "cultural touchstones that reflect and celebrate our Canadian experience."

The \$100 bills will recognize breakthroughs in Canadian research with a series showcasing a picture of a bottle of insulin. The timing is perfect, coinciding with the discovery of insulin 90 years ago at the University of Toronto.

which included removing trim, baseboards, door frames, and thousands of nails. Extra care was taken to preserve wood, cabinets, windows, and the original hardware floors.

David Sadleir says, "Everyone is thrilled with the progress. The Farmhouse is the project's pivot point. It shows how much people want to preserve Sir Fred's legacy, and how connected they are to him.

The Farmhouse is in perfect order now to begin the heavy job of tearing down walls and ceilings in order to replace them with structural integrity.

Sadleir continues, "My sincere thanks to all for their hard work and contributions. One building at a time, and we'll get there, so we're counting on your continued support!"

A Three Stage Revival

The Banting Heritage site will be an international destination offering diabetes outreach facilities, heritage exhibits, and a welcoming educational venue for families and visitors.

The development of the Sir Frederick Banting's birthplace includes (i) Restoring the Farmhouse; (ii) Constructing a Diabetes Outreach Clinic and Learning Centre for outpatients with telemedicine and international conferencing for medical professionals and the public; and (iii) Constructing a Heritage Exhibit building to complement the main floor Farmhouse exhibit space.

The Farmhouse will be completed in early 2012 followed by a start on the Outreach and Education building, and then the Heritage building in mid 2013.
